**Chancellor's
Chain of Office**

The University Mace and Chancellor's Chain of Office are significant icons of the institution and stand as impressive symbols on permanent display in the lobby of Founders Hall when not in service.

Creation of the mace and chain was commissioned to New York artist and professor of silversmithing at State University of New York, Kurt J. Masdorf in 1977.

The University Mace and Chancellor's Chain of Office are emblazoned with the institution's name along with symbols of Tennessee, the state whose citizens we serve. Borrowing from ancient traditions, these handcrafted ceremonial pieces create interest and respect by both participants and observers. They have become important representations honoring and identifying our educational personage.

ACADEMIC REGALIA

The origins of academic dress date back to the 12th and 13th centuries, when universities were taking form. The ordinary dress of the scholar, whether student or teacher, was the dress of a cleric. With few exceptions, the medieval scholar had taken at least minor orders, made certain vows, and perhaps been tonsured. Long gowns were worn and may have been necessary for warmth in unheated buildings. Hoods seem to have served to cover the tonsured head until superseded for that purpose by the skull cap.

A statute of the University of Coimbra in 1321 required that all "Doctors, Licentiate, and Bachelors" wear gowns. In England, in the second half of the 14th century, the statutes of certain colleges forbade "excess in apparel" and prescribed the wearing of a long gown. In the days of Henry VIII of England, Oxford and Cambridge first began prescribing a definite academic dress and made it a matter of university control even to the extent of its minor details.

The assignment of colors to signify certain faculties was to be a much later development and one which was to be standardized only in the United States in the late 19th century. White taken from the white fur trimming of the Oxford and Cambridge B.A. hoods was assigned to arts and letters. Red, one of the traditional colors of the church, went to theology. Green, the color of medieval herbs, was adopted for medicine; and olive, because it was so close to green, was given to pharmacy. Golden yellow, standing for the wealth which scientific research has produced, was assigned to the sciences.

European institutions have always had great diversity in their specifications of academic dress, and this has been a source of confusion. In contrast, American colleges and universities opted for a definite system that all might follow. A significant contribution to the development of this system was made by Gardner Cotrell Leonard of Albany, New York. Mr. Leonard designed gowns for his class at Williams College in

1887 and had them made by Cotrell and Leonard, a firm established by his family in Albany. He was greatly interested in the subject, and following the publication of an article by him on academic dress in 1893, was invited to work with an intercollegiate commission made up of representatives of leading institutions to establish a suitable system of academic apparel. The commission met at Columbia University in 1895 and adopted a code of academic dress, which besides regulating the cut and style and materials of gowns, prescribed the colors which were to represent the different fields of learning.

In 1932, the American Council on Education authorized the appointment of a committee “to determine whether revision and completion of the academic code adopted by the conference of the colleges and universities in 1895 is desirable at this time, and, if so, to draft a revised code and present a plan for submitting the code to the consideration of the institutional members of the Council.” The committee reviewed the situation through correspondence and conference and approved a code for academic costumes that has been in effect since that year.

A Committee on Academic Costumes and Ceremonies, appointed by the American Council on Education in 1959, again reviewed the costume code and made several changes. In 1986, the committees updated the code and added a sentence clarifying the use of the color dark blue for the Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) degree.

It is customary at many colleges and universities for the tassel to be worn on the right side of the cap by degree candidates. Upon conferral of the degree, the tassel is then moved from right to left. For all academic purposes, including trimmings of doctoral gowns and edging of hoods, the colors associated with different disciplines represented at The University of Tennessee at Chattanooga are as follows.

Chancellor’s Medal of Excellence

The Chancellor’s Medal of Excellence was established in 2022 by UTC’s 17th Chancellor, Dr. Steven R. Angle, to commemorate his 10th year at the University and establish a means for UTC to recognize manifestations of excellence impacting the institution. The award is intended to be presented periodically, at the sole discretion of the Chancellor, to a faculty, staff, alumnus, or community member who has made extraordinary contributions to the character of the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga.

ACADEMIC GONFALONS

Over centuries of tradition, flags and gonfalons have become common components of academic ceremonies, adding color and dignity to processions and daises.

The gonfalon is a heraldic banner, often pointed or swallow-tailed, that hangs suspended from a crosspiece or frame, often adorned with chords or streamers. Many universities around the world have adopted the gonfalon as a college or institutional insignia and use them to identify and lead colleges and schools in academic processions. Our academic gonfalons represent the academic divisions making up the university and are carried to usher in graduates and faculty.

Gonfalons are among the earliest documented form of banners used in Western European culture and are reminiscent of the military standards used by the Roman Empire legions. Around the 12th century, Florence, Italy, was divided into districts with each adopting its own banner and insignia. Gonfalons became symbols of state or office and were carried in processions by a chief magistrate or other elected official.

In academic tradition, gonfalons have come to incorporate symbolic images and often utilize the regalia colors associated with specific disciplines. Unity among a school's units is often demonstrated by a uniform use of one or more of the school's colors. The University of Tennessee at Chattanooga academic gonfalons reflect a design in keeping with these traditional standards, yet when displayed together create a vibrant and progressive image reflective of our campus and community. The blue band across the top of each banner and the gold fringe at the bottom provide a visual connection to the campus, while the icons and colors are reflective of the academic disciplines and principles related to the separate divisions.

Additionally, an impressive fabric backdrop depicts various campus architectural icons. When used in conjunction, the academic gonfalons and backdrop create a stunning canvas on which to celebrate the achievements of our graduates and campus.

History of the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga

Since its founding as Chattanooga University in 1886, the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga has developed into an institution of excellence, blending both private and public traditions of higher education.

For 83 years, the University was private. Three years after its founding, the University consolidated with another East Tennessee Wesleyan University at Athens, under the name of Grant University. In 1907, the University of Chattanooga was born.

In 1969, the University of Chattanooga and Chattanooga City College, a junior college, merged with the University of Tennessee, one of the nation's largest land grant universities, and became the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga. As part of the UT System, UTC's mandate was to focus its resources on excellence in undergraduate education and in selected areas of graduate study.

Upon the merger, the University of Chattanooga Foundation was created and retains and manages the endowment established before the institution became public. Income from the endowment provides scholarships, distinguished professorships, and special programs not usually found on the campus of a state-supported institution. In 2019, the UC Foundation endowment stood at \$186.4 million.

Over the last 50 years, UTC has grown enrollment, expanded its campus, and continues to grow partnerships within Chattanooga, across the world, and many points in between. With a reputation for quality in undergraduate teaching and support from both private and public sources, the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga is a driving force for education, excellence, engagement, and inspiring positive change for our students and our community.
